

## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2023 Saturday, 11 November 2023

According to the IM24CA Constitution, motions, amendments and nominations for the AGM shall be proposed only by the Executive Committee, NCA's, the Technical Committee and World Sailing and must reach the International Secretary not less than eight (8) weeks before the officially announced date of the meeting. Only the motions, amendments and nominations on the Agenda and its attachment/s shall be voted upon. The Chairman may, in exceptional circumstances, accept amendments from the floor of the AGM when, in his opinion, this will assist the resolution of issues on which the World Council have had an opportunity to express its views.

The deadline for the submissions for the 2023 AGM is *October 8<sup>th</sup>*, *2023*. To allow this process to function smoothly, each Submission should adhere to the following guidelines:

- The Submission shall clearly state the current position along with the proposal for a change (clearly stating the rule) and the rationale behind this change.
- The Submission should be written to relate to any IM24CA documents or topics as listed below.
- Wherever possible, each submission should contain wording for the proposed new rules.
- Reason for the motion
- Technical items the tech staff can work on during the year should not be sent as a Submission

**C.10.2 LIMITATIONS** 

(a) Not more than 1 mainsail, 1 headsail and 2 spinnakers shall be carried aboard.
(b) Not more than 1 mainsail, 1 headsail and 2 spinnakers shall be presented for registration and used during an event of less than 8 consecutive days, except when a sail has been lost or

damaged beyond repair.

(c) Sails (excluding gennakers) shall not be changed or substituted whilst underway or away from the dockside.

## Reason

This rule was asked to be clarified by the jury at the North Americans this year in Toronto. Not being familiar with the class, they asked us to explain C.10.2(c) commenting the rule seems to contradict itself. We are allowed to change spinnakers during a race or race day while away from the dockside. All to suggest we should delete C.10.2(c) and while we are at it get rid of the "more than 8 days" part.
